Did you know that sole proprietors are not counted as part of the Mass. Workforce?

Only employees count. Not the business owner.

We find this fact amazing and got so agitated about it that we got a new research study done telling us how many sole proprietors are really out there. The eye opening report, conducted by Prof. Laurence E. Goss, Jr. of the Salem State College Geography Department using 2004 Federal and State data concluded that in 2004 there were:

- 424,172 sole proprietorships in Massachusetts
- 49,494 in Essex County

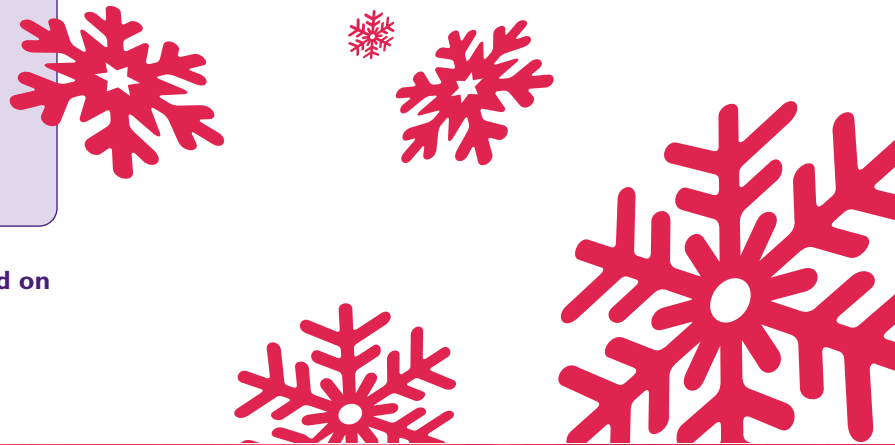
The report further concluded that:

- They make up 17% of the workforce
- Sole proprietors and micro businesses (those with less than 4 employees) make up 86% of all businesses in Mass and 88% in Essex County.

So if you are a very small business owner, be proud. You are in good company. And the Enterprise Center wants to know more about you and what you need. (See January 30 sole proprietor get together.)

Sole proprietors and micro businesses do not get enough attention. Yet they accounted for 35% of job growth in Mass between 1994 and 2004.
